The committee was responsible for evaluating nearly 360 submission this year (818were submitted by FBA members). Of the 11 pieces added this year, 2 were submitted by the FBA membership and not publishers. Below is the recommendation of the committee for additions to the FBA Concert Music List.

(Approved FBA MPA) CONCERT MUSIC LIST NEW ADDITIONS 2021-22

FBA Concert Music Committee Discussion and Recommendations Concerning Flex-Band Pieces/Arrangements for use at FBA Concert MPA

The FBA Concert Music Committee understands that there are diverse needs within school band programs in the state of Florida, especially as we begin to emerge from the current pandemic. The committee was asked to make a decision concerning adding pieces arranged for flexible instrumentation (flex-band) to the music list. The following represent the view of the committee concerning this and recommendations to other FBA committees and to the FBA board that may help meet the needs of our band programs while maintaining the rigor of the assessment process keeping in mind the stated purpose of FBA MPAs which include:

(From the FBA Handbook)

- I. To provide opportunities for students and directors to perform in an environment which provides critical evaluation of its performance by noted experts in the field of marching, concert, and jazz band performance.
- II. To provide the opportunity for students and directors to perform for their peers in a formal concert setting or marching band venue.
- III. To provide a performance opportunity which will serve as a motivational goal for students and directors.
- IV. To provide an opportunity for students and directors to see and hear performances of their peers and learn from observing these performances.
- V. To provide a goal, which is so compelling that, the preparation for attaining that goal becomes the vehicle for continued growth and to demonstrate students' abilities to apply musical and marching fundamentals and concepts in a performance setting.

Salient points mentioned at our November meeting concerning flex-band pieces/arrangements include:

- -Bands with incomplete instrumentation have unique needs that FBA should be constantly aware of and continually addressing in its practices concerning MPA's. More bands are experiencing this for the first time due to the current pandemic, prompting a more global sense of urgency to address this issue.
- -Small schools with incomplete instrumentation have been participating in concert MPAs for decades and many small-school directors have mastered the practice of making adjustments to cover parts that are missing in their instrumentation without compromising the integrity of the piece(s) being performed.
- -FBA and ASBDA have provided multiple training sessions at FMEA clinic and Summer Convention (Conference) addressing how to adapt a full-instrumentation score for bands with incomplete instrumentation. This practice has been a professional responsibility of band directors for decades. We encourage FBA to provide further guidance and training on this practice and encourage experienced band directors to assist newer band directors in this practice as well.
- -The Concert Music List is intended to contain vetted pieces that FBA has determined to be exemplary works of the highest artistic merit at a variety of developmentally appropriate levels in order for students to experience art music through the medium of wind band as performers and ultimately as consumers.
- -Flex-band arrangements, by nature, have many instrumentation choices which may affect the overall sonority, balance, and blend of the ensemble. Sonority balance and blend are addressed on the adjudication sheet. However, choice of instrumentation assignment or combination is not something that adjudicators are in a position to evaluate as instrumentation choice is not mentioned on the adjudication sheet.
- -Aspects of deciding a grade level for a piece being added to the concert music list include instrumentation, range, and texture. Flex arrangements, in large part, do away with that and therefore, it is nearly impossible to determine if a piece arranged for flex band is of the same grade level as the original.

- -We have no vehicle for determining whether an ensemble performing a flex arrangement at MPA is doing so because of instruments missing or because of weak sections. The later practice seems counter-intuitive to points III and V of "Purposes for Band MPA" as stated in the handbook.
- -It has been a long-standing practice that groups who are not ready to be evaluated for a rating at

MPA for a variety of reasons still get to experience the motivational component of performance at the event with comments from adjudicators in lieu of a rating.

It is the recommendation of the Concert Music Committee that:

- -The MPA Committee allow bands to perform flex-band arrangements of pieces currently on the FBA Concert Music List at District Concert MPA for the 2021-2022 school year for comments only.
- -FBA continues to encourage the practice of directors rewriting parts to cover missing instrumentation.
- -FBA provides directors professional development opportunities at convention and/or online regarding best practices in covering parts in missing instrumentation in preparation for MPA
- -No flex-band arrangements or pieces will be added to the FBA Concert Music List.
- -The MPA or Ethics Committee make a clarifying statement that submitting scores of a piece to adjudicators but then playing a different arrangement (including flex-band) on stage is unethical and is grounds for disqualification for the event. NOTE: Any changes made to a piece on the FBA list due to instrumentation shortcomings on stage must be indicated on the scores submitted to judges. Covering missing parts as indicated by written edits in scores submitted to judges is encouraged for bands with instrumentation challenges and is NOT grounds for disqualification.

Report to the Executive Board - December 2021

There were approximately 90 submissions presented to the S&E Committee. The committee should be finished evaluating all submissions by December 7, 2021.

Revisions to the submission process that will be put in place for next year:

The date Directors can expect an answer for their submissions

Many District Chairs have emailed me about when Directors will have answers concerning their submissions. Putting an exact date in the Open Window email should alleviate any questions regarding this issue.

> An absolute statement that NO submissions will be accepted after the deadline

I have received several emails asking for approvals after the submission deadline. I have approved none of them. I cannot approve one without approving all, so the deadline is the deadline. Perhaps putting that in the initial email will stop Directors from asking the S&E Chair to extend the deadline.

A statement that accepted pieces will be added to the S&E List

All accepted pieces are added to the S&E List. After the posted date, Directors should search the List under the category of their submitted piece(s). Most of the time pieces are added under the Grade submitted. Occasionally a piece is added at a different Grade. I suggest a Command Find to search for the piece.

In the case of Student Submissions, if they are accepted, a Special Permission designation is given and the Director should receive the proper notification. Student Submissions are never added to the list and are usually allowed as a Grade 4.

A statement that Directors will receive an email if their submissions are denied

If a piece is denied, an email is sent to the Director with an explanation of why it was denied.

Again, a special thank you to Doug Moser for his work on the Percussion submissions and general upkeep of our very extensive Percussion List.

Also, thanks to Richard Uhler for his help and to the rest of the committee members: Randy Sonntag, Christine Pascual, Roanna Combs, and Mike Dressman, who helped with this year's submissions.

Current Projects:

- 1. Dr. Jeffrey Traster, composed a grade 4 work titled *Way Down* for \$1,500. It was slated for premiere by the 2020 Nine Star Honor Band but due to COVID, it will be premiered by the H.B. Plant HS Wind Ensemble in February at the NBA/CBDNA Southern Divisional at the University of South Carolina and then at the 2022 Nine Star Honor Band. This piece will be published on the composer's website once the premiere happens. Score and Parts have been delivered.
- 2. The 2022 all-state MS jazz ensemble will premiere *Blues at the Roundabout* by Victor Goines.
- 3. The committee has signed a contract for Robert Longfield to compose a work for the 2022 Florida All-Community Band held during the FBA Summer Conference.
- 4. The Commissioning Committee received several submissions for the FBA Young Composer Competition. The winning piece will be announced at the FMEA conference and will be premiered/performed at the 2023 FMEA conference.

FBA Strategic Planning Committee report

Submitted by Cathi Leibinger on behalf of the Strategic planning Committee December 2021 Board meeting

Process

Meeting #1 was held Monday, June 28, 2021 during the FBA Summer Conference

The committee discussed the purpose of the project, identified issues presented by the D18 proposal for redistricting and discussed them in the context of the entire organization. The essential questions asked were: What are the underlying causes of the issues presented? What are the ultimate goals to be reached from the plan?

The following timeline and process was established:

- Data collection of FSMA numbers to be completed by November 1, 2021 **(COMPLETED)**
- Survey to be prepared and presented to membership to take place prior to or at second district meetings. (no later than November 19, 2021) (COMPLETED)
- Strategic Planning Committee meeting #2 (held virtually) between November 20 December 2, 2021 (COMPLETED)
- FBA Board meeting December 2-4, 2021
 - Report findings (COMPLETED)
 - Board discussion/recommendations (SEE BELOW)
- Strategic Planning Committee meeting #3 in person at FMEA
- District chairs present at Meeting #3 for district discussion
- Strategic Planning Committee meeting #2 (held virtually) between February 1 April 1, 2022
- Updated findings sent to District chairs to discuss at meeting #4
- Chair will look for discussion points and recommendations from District minutes
- Meeting #5 (if needed) via Zoom between district meeting #4 and state board meeting in May 2022
- Present Final report/recommendations to May 2022 Board meeting.
- If action/vote is needed:
 - By-Laws changes: Board votes in May AND June, Membership vote at June conference.
 - Handbook changes: Board votes in May OR June, Membership vote at June conference.
 - No changes take effect until the 2022-2023 school year.

Committee Recommendations

After reviewing the data collected from the districts, the largest area of concern was directed to transportation concerns. Over 12% of reporting members listed the cost of transportation as their highest negative impact to their participation in MPA's with an additional 15% listing this

obstacle as their second highest negative impact. In addition, over 20% of reporting directors listed arranging transportation as either their highest or second highest greatest negative effect in regards to their participation in MPA.

These data points brought many areas of discussion for the committee including the way MPAs are run, the location(s) of MPAs, cost for assessment, and additional issues that may be forming across the state. Members of the committee were also able to share different tactics or strategies that worked in additional areas of the state that could be duplicated in other areas as a starting point to overcome obstacles regarding assessment. Questions regarding participation were analyzed and discussed regarding other areas of MPA as well such as ratings, validity, feedback, value, time, and others.

The committee also discussed and reviewed the proposal from district 18 to create a new district to ease financial and distance issues that are developing in their area. The committee discussed briefly if redistricting across the state was a better alternative based on growth data that was presented throughout the meeting.

As a result of the findings in the survey, in conjunction with the discussions held by the committee - the committee recommends the following:

- 1. Encouragement to District Chairmen to feel encouraged to move away from traditional models and outlines of assessment if it provides ease to the district and its members with the understanding that there should be no loss in merit of the event.
- 2. Suggest the Finance Committee review the \$1.20 assessment fee that is charged to districts at the conclusion of each year to either:
 - a. Rework the money collected to allow for an MPA Transportation Grant that would allow directors in the state the opportunity to request additional funding to help reduce the burden of transportation to Assessment Events.
 - b. Add an additional \$0.01 \$0.05 increase to the fee to initiate an MPA Transportation Grant.
- 3. Suggest that the Executive Committee look for innovative ways to provide support for programs in the state who are scored low at Music Performance Assessments through a partnership with the Mentorship Committee.
 - a. Example pairing low performing programs with a mentor (perhaps a retired director) who would be able to come in and work with the band and teacher throughout the year to help them diagnose issues, work through solutions, and achieve greater results from the following year's assessment. There would likely be a cost associated with this plan in order to compensate the mentor for their time.
 - i. Rationale: We pay Master Adjudicators to work with interning adjudicators. Interning adjudicators are directors who have already demonstrated a level of success within their programs. Whereas, we do not have a method currently to provide support(s) to members of our organization who are working in low performing environments.
- 4. Execute a pilot program for one year that targets redistricting in the western and southwestern areas of the state in order to gather data the committee feels is necessary before making permanent changes to the bylaws. It is believed that the breakdown below

will balance the counties and the four geographical areas to become more balanced.

- a. Hardee County would participate with Polk County in District 12.
- b. Charlotte, DeSoto, Lee, and Hendry Counties would join together as District 18.
- c. Sarasota, and Manatee Counties would remain as District 11.
- d. Collier County would become its own District, District 22.
 - i. If a district did not have a current District Chairmen living in that district, then the Executive Director would appoint a state representative to run MPAs, hire judges, and manage finances of that district for the purposes of the pilot program.

Next steps:

The committee would like district chairs to discuss these findings with their membership at their 3rd meeting and forward any concerns or suggestions to the committee for possible consideration before the final report is submitted in May.

Jazz Committee: All state jazz committee please review the consistency between All-State audition requirements and what is listed on the All-State Script and provided recordings before the first audition weekend. This year there were several discrepancies between what was required and what the script said to read. (This was able to be fixed during the actual audition day, but put things behind. Emma Haley

Dist.4-meeting 2

Technology Committee: Would it be possible to set up an adjudicators' portal in MPA Online for adjudicators to record comments on their own device (phone/tablet) and upload them directly to MPA online like other organizations do? We have had issues with our MP3 recorders not working correctly, or an adjudicator struggling to use the MP3 recorders. Usually the first band at an event has at least one recording that is incomplete or missing due to issues with the MP3 recorders or user error. Allowing adjudicators to use a device they are more familiar with would help this issue. If adjudicators had the ability to upload their comments directly to MPA Online this would allow comments to be available immediately, or unlock when at a time the district chair has set. This would also save the district chair the work of uploading comments to MPA Online the day after an MPA if there is no wi-fi available at the MPA site.

Motion: Our reserve fund (also called hurricane and or rainy day fund) should be reported with the treasurer's report at every district meeting.

Rationale: The reserve fund started around 2007 when a hurricane cancelled our Marching MPA and adversely affected our assessments for that year. It was agreed that the district chairman would set aside money every year so that we would have a reserve fund. This fund has been called several things (reserve fund, hurricane fund, rainy day fund etc..) it has been held by FBA but it is our money to use as needed. For instance, it could be used for a commission or a purchase (i.e. pianos for S&E etc...) Over the years, the fund was used periodically for various reason and more or less replenished. The fund should have a significant amount in it but for some reason, the amount or the existence of the fund, is never mentioned at our meetings. District members have to (the) right to know we have a reserve fund and the exact amount in it should be reported with the financials at every meeting.

These Funds have always been, and continue to be, held by the Executive Director in a separate Bank Account. MOTION #7: DEFEATED

Dist. 15-meeting 2

Dayna Cole/J. Nista (2nd): Motion to the FBA Executive Board and the MPA Music Committee The music of Richard Wagner be REMOVED from our Approved FBA MPA Concert Music List. Rationale: Last year, the FBA Executive Committee made the decision to remove Henry Fillmore's name from our Composition Contest Award based on the fact that some of his music had racial implications and we, as an association, did not feel that his name properly represented our values.

It is well known that Wagner was an anti-Semite and that he was outspoken about his views. Many music historians believe that his anti-Semitic views influenced much of his music.

How can we, as an Association, remove Fillmore's name from our composition award based on our values, but not remove the music of Wagner?

Our MPA Music List contains selections we feel are appropriate for performance at our FBA/FSMA MPA sponsored events. It is NOT a list of what a Director can/cannot perform at any other school performance. I am not saying that a band should never play Wagner's music: just NOT at an event that represents our Association.

Motion Passed Unanimously.

MOTION #8: by BOARD to send to the EXEC. COMMITTEE - B. Mounger/L. Commander Passed by the Board

Dayna Cole/R. Uhler (2nd): Motion to add a .5 Grade level Category to our Approved FBA MPA Concert Music List

Rationale: Currently, our MPA Music List contains 125 Grade 1 selections. Out of those 125:

- 18 of them are Out of Print
- Another 27 (including some of the OOP) have not been performed at an MPA event in the past 5 years.
- Many of the recently added selections are lyrical with an extremely limited use of percussion

Our current Classification system requires a Class A Band to play a minimum of grade 1 & 1 (2) and are BOTH MD's and BOTH sight-read the SAME music. The lower end of our list has no depth and does not allow for MS 2nd and 3rd Bands to have the same type of experience as the HS Bands. The HS progression goes from 9 to 6 to 3. The MS progression goes from 3 or 4 to 2, 2, 2...

The other issue of our Grade 1 list is the recent over-adding of lyrical compositions with an extremely limited use of percussion - a Suspended Cymbal roll here and a Triangle beat there. Every Band Director has struggled with troublesome percussionists. The idler they are, the worse their behavior! The fact that their part in many of the pieces does not allow for their proper development, and that they end up sitting around doing not much is unacceptable. Does any adjudicator really want to hear a MS 2nd or 3rd Band play a lyrical piece of music?

With a .5 Category, an MB could play 2 & 2 (4),their 2nd Band 1 & 1(2), and their 3rd Band .5 and .5(1). While this is not as big as progression as the HS Bands, it does consider the fact that MS Bands need more depth and more options.

We need a special Music Committee to look specifically at the .5's coming out and creating a Music List that allows MS Bands some depth and an appropriate level of performance for 2nd and 3rd Bands. This would also require a different SR for the 3rd Band.

Notes about nominations:

- There were too many flute (21 first choice) and trumpet (19 first choice) nominated. There were not enough clarinets (23 first choice) or trombones (10 first choice) nominated.
- Submissions should be completed in full, by the deadline for students to be considered. Directors should not expect their first choice to be selected automatically.
- For schools that have multiple levels (both HS and MS), the system currently identifies by school and doesn't split out MS and HS. We tried our best to check all schools in this instance and are working towards solutions to ensure all schools are represented in the future.
- Students need to know scales to be considered for an honor band. It is our responsibility as educators to teach our beginners scales.
- Solo and Ensemble participation from the previous year helps determine skill level. Please include title, grade level, and rating.
- The main purpose of this ensemble is to offer more middle schools the opportunity to have participation in an all state group and give more directors the opportunity to attend the conference. Many directors feel that students MUST audition for all state to be nominated for the honor band. The Honor Band IS NOT a second Middle School All State Band. We need all middle school directors to submit their top students, regardless of whether or not you have students audition for all state.
- The information on range for students was not helpful. I recommend removing this data point from the nomination form.
- McLane Middle School did not have a student selected this year and will be considered first for next year's band.

Suggestion: Address the issue of only one student nominated by requiring a minimum number of students nominated for schools to be considered (Recommend 2).

Why these schools? These schools provided 2-5 nominees that included instruments that the band needed, specifically in the areas of low brass, clarinet, bassoon, and french horn. Also, the nominations included, in great detail, the students' playing abilities, musicianship, and previous ensemble history.

- 26 of 115 schools had students make the auditioned band.
- 0 students were withdrawn this year due to late FBA memberships.
- 24 schools nominated only 1 student or one instrument for multiple nominations.
- All parts were assigned based on nomination and in coordination with the conductor
- Music was uploaded to Google Drive through MPA online

Deadline for Honor Band paperwork was 10/1, All-State audition band results were released on 11/1.

Summary: As long as paperwork was in well before the deadline, any paperwork issues (missing signatures, incomplete submissions) were addressed and corrected by contacting the director. Numbers increased from last year- possibly due to the later deadline or simply returning to "normal" from the COVID year. Concert MPA ratings were difficult to take into consideration with many bands not

participating last year due to COVID. Many directors asked if there would be an option to pay online in the future as we have now started this option for other FBA fees. Make sure mentors/district chairs are encouraging first year directors to follow through with nominating honor band students. It may be beneficial to require directors to nominate at least two students of different instruments in order to be considered for the ensemble. Single nominees make the selection and instrumentation process more difficult. Other directors that follow the rules and nominate multiple students end up having their second choice chosen in order to make room for single nomination schools. In general, nominations should include relevant, detailed & specific information about the student's playing ability (especially with percussion). Directors should remember that their students' part assignments are also based solely on the nomination, which can be difficult to assign when directors write very little. If students play a secondary "specialty" instrument such as piano, english horn, soprano sax, etc., that should also be noted in the nomination.
